Curriculum planning documents - Val Sabin.	£795	To update an old scheme of work which is used by all teachers to support them in planning PE lessons.	A new scheme of work for teachers to use when planning and running PE lessons, including up to date music and resources. The scheme takes account of the new curriculum and has ensured that teachers are compliant when teaching PE lessons.
Gymnastics Coaching	£804	Gymnastics coaching for staff in response to staff questionnaires requesting further CPD.	All staff had the opportunity to observe and work with coaches whilst she taught KS2 classes. Children received high quality lessons and school was provided with a bank of resources to support them in gymnastics teaching in future years, along with guidance on structuring high quality lessons. The coaching resulted in an inspirational visit from Olympic medallist Beth Tweddle, who gave an assembly to the children about the importance of a healthy lifestyle.
Inspection and repairs to equipment.	£343.11	To ensure that PE equipment is compliant and safe to use.	An inspection took place of all sports equipment. Essential repairs were identified and these repairs took place, ensuring that all equipment meets the required standard and is safe to use.
Rugby (professional coaching) for curriculum and CPD, including after school provision.	£3426	To provide Rugby coaching to KS2 for the year; providing them with opportunities to develop motor skills, along with teamwork, respect and fair play. Following the popularity of the coaching last year and the positive impact on PE, an after-school club was requested.	All KS2 teachers have had the opportunity to work with the coaches to develop skills in teaching rugby. All KS2 children have developed their skills within the game and have had the chance to be competitive with inter-school games. An after-school club was established for children of KS1 and this was well attended by children, most of whom had never attended a sporting after school club.

Football - Stockport County Football Club (professional coaching).	£2260	To provide professional football coaching for KS1 children and to work with teachers as part of their continuing professional development. To establish links with local sports clubs.	All KS1 children have had the opportunity to work with the coaches to develop their motor skills. Children have learnt to work as part of a team. Children had the opportunity to be competitive throughout the lessons and through a tournament organised by the club. Children have been offered free tickets to watch Stockport County play at their local stadium, thereby establishing links with the local community.
Sports Day	£113.60	To provide specific equipment, including stickers and medals in order to establish a regular School Sports Day.	All children have had the opportunity to compete at school sports day and to win medals and stickers.
Resources needed to establish a new Healthy Eating Squad, providing health and nutrition information to all year groups.	£43	Children to form a healthy eating squad which will be responsible for giving nutrition information to classes across the school on a weekly basis, including promoting health/wellbeing at playtimes.	The healthy eating squad have now been selected and are preparing their lessons to begin in January 2016.
Cheerleading after-school club	£450	To respond to parent feedback to provide more dance-based after school clubs.	The cheerleading club has been well attended and has contributed to an increase in the number of children participating in extra-curricular sports. Teachers have had the opportunity to observe the coach as part of their CPD.
