<p>Costs relating to the creation of a 'Health Squad'.</p> <p>Health Squad uniform: Reward cards and stickers for fruit and veg.</p>	<p>£23.03 £78.88</p>	<p>A 'Health Squad' has been created to improve health and wellbeing across school. Each week the squad visits all classes to deliver a healthy message. They also run competitions and reward schemes to improve health across school.</p>	<p>The Health Squad introduced a reward scheme to promote healthy snacks at playtime. This had an immediate and dramatic effect on the number of children bringing in fruit and veg for their snack at playtime. A competition was launched to design a letter to parents to ask them to send healthy food in to school. This was highly popular and the majority of children in school took part. The letter was then sent to parents to improve awareness. Children have been given many healthy message including the importance of cutting down sugar in their food.</p>
<p>Gymnastics Coaching</p>	<p>£720</p>	<p>Gymnastics coaching for staff in response to staff questionnaires requesting further CPD.</p>	<p>All staff had the opportunity to observe and work with coaches during the KS2 lessons. Children received high quality lessons and school was provided with a bank of resources to support them in gymnastics teaching in future years, along with guidance on structuring high quality lessons. The coaching resulted in an inspirational visit from Olympic medallist Beth Tweddle, who gave an assembly to the children about the importance of a healthy lifestyle.</p>
<p>Rugby (professional coaching) for curriculum and CPD, including after school provision.</p>	<p>£3325</p>	<p>To provide Rugby coaching to KS2 for the year; providing them with opportunities to develop motor skills, along with teamwork, respect and fair play. Following the popularity of the coaching last year and the positive impact on PE, the after-school club has continued to give opportunities for KS1 to participate also.</p>	<p>All KS2 teachers have had the opportunity to work with the coaches to develop skills in teaching rugby and fitness skills. All KS2 children have developed their skills within the game and have had the chance to be competitive with inter-school games. This included a very successful World Cup Rugby day at the beginning of the year which was a tournament for all children. An after-school club has continued for children of KS1 and this was well attended by children, most of whom had never attended a sporting after school club.</p>

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Football - Stockport County Football Club (professional coaching).	£2080	To provide professional football coaching for KS1 children and to work with teachers as part of their continuing professional development. To establish links with local sports clubs.	All KS1 children have had the opportunity to work with the coaches to develop their motor skills. Children have learnt to work as part of a team. Children had the opportunity to be competitive throughout the lessons and through a tournament organised by the club. Children have been offered free tickets to watch Stockport County play at their local stadium, thereby establishing links with the local community.
Sports Day	£121.46	To provide specific equipment, including stickers and medals in order to establish a regular School Sports Day.	All children have had the opportunity to compete at school sports day and to win medals and stickers.
Cheerleading after-school club	£550	To respond to parent feedback to provide more dance-based after school clubs.	The cheerleading club has been well attended and has contributed to an increase in the number of children participating in extra-curricular sports. Teachers have had the opportunity to observe the coach as part of their CPD. This continues to be one of the most popular after school clubs.
