Primary PE Passport	£575	To provide an online and easy assessment and planning tool for teachers to use to ensure progression throughout the year groups.	The system is in the process of being introduced, however there was a delay in implementation due to new GDPR regulations. These have now been resolved and the system will be implemented for the next academic year.
Stockport Harriers Cross Country League.	£52	Entry for KS2 children to join the Cross Country League with the objective of increasing competition throughout the school.	The event was well attended and gave children the opportunity to compete against other schools. The children have promoted the event at school and it is hoped that more children will participate next year.
Football – Stockport County Football Club (professional coaching).	£3280	To provide professional football coaching for KS1 and KS2 children, including an after-school club to increase competitiveness in KS2 children. Also, to teach motor skills to children in reception. Furthermore, to work with teachers as part of their continuing professional development. To establish links with local sports clubs.	All Reception, KS1 and KS2 children have had the opportunity to work with the coaches to develop their motor skills. Children have learnt to work as part of a team, the importance of which was further outlined in a special assembly for the children where a member of the First team spoke to them about healthy lifestyles. Children have been offered free tickets to watch Stockport County play at their local stadium, thereby establishing links with the local community. The teachers have worked closely with the coaches to ensure that they are able to sustain the high level of coaching once the funding ends.
Physical Development Equipment for the Early Years	£2238.13	To improve opportunities to improve Physical Development in Early Years.	A range of equipment has been purchased to enhance the provision in the Early Years. This has been bought to encourage Physical Development of the children and provide them with the opportunities to improve fine and gross motor skills. The result has been an increase in the progress that children have made in this area, and this will be sustainable for many years to come.
Annual check of sports equipment.	£343.09	To ensure that PE equipment and apparatus in school meets the required safety standards.	All equipment has been checked and is safe to use.
