## Charging Policy

### Introduction

All education undertaken during school hours is free. We do not charge for any activity undertaken as part of the national Curriculum with the exception of individual music or group tuition.

### Voluntary Contributions

When organising school trips or visits which enrich the curriculum and educational experience of the children, the school invites parents to contribute to the cost of the trip. All contributions are voluntary. If we do not receive sufficient voluntary contributions, we may cancel a trip. If a trip goes ahead, it may include children whose parents have not paid any contribution. We do not treat these children differently from any others.

If a parent wishes their child to take part in a school trip or event, but is unwilling or unable to make a voluntary contribution, we do allow the child to participate fully in the trip or activity. Sometimes the school pays additional costs in order to support the visit.

The following is a list of additional activities organised by the school, which require voluntary contributions from parents. These activities are known as “optional extras”. This list is not exhaustive:

- Visits to museums;  
Sporting activities which require transport expenses;  
outdoor adventure activities;
- Visits to the theatre;
- Musical events.

### Residential Visits

At Our Lady’s School we organise two residential visits for children in Years 5 and 6. We make a charge for travel, board, food, excursions and professional trainers who provide the activities. Parents and carers are provided with a savings card to spread the cost of these trips. Any parents and carers who are unable to fund the full cost of the trip can make alternative arrangements with the Headteacher.

### Music Tuition

All children study music at Our Lady’s School as part of the normal school curriculum. We do not charge for this.

There is a charge for individual or group music tuition if this is not part of the National Curriculum. The peripatetic music teachers teach individual or small group lessons. We make a charge for these lessons. We give parents information about additional music tuition at the start of each academic year.

### Swimming

Our Lady’s School organises swimming lessons for all children in Key Stage 2. These take place in school time and are part of the National Curriculum. We make no charge for this activity. We inform parents when these lessons are to take place.

### After School Activities

Our Lady’s School offers additional after school activities. When a qualified coach/instructor, or a member of the school runs and organises these sessions, we may make a small charge for these sessions.
